IN BOSTON, PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. IN PHILADELPHIA, PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. IN NEW ENGLAND, PRICES WERE 3 CENTS HIGHER AND THE LARGE THROUGH JUMBO SIZES, AND 2 CENTS HIGHER ON THE MEDIUM AND LIGHTER WEIGHTS. THE MARKET TONE WAS FULLY STEADY. RETAIL DEMAND WAS MOSTLY MODERATE WITH SCATTERED FEATURE ACTIVITY USUALLY GENERATING ADDITIONAL INTEREST. SUPPLIES OF ALL SIZES WERE WELL BALANCED, AND USUALLY HELD WITH CONFIDENCE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE, AND DEMAND FOR ADDITIONAL PRODUCT WAS NO BETTER THAN FAIR. LIGHT TYPE FOWL WERE AMPLE FOR CURRENT NEEDS.

Daily National Grain Market Summary  
Grain and soybean bids finished mostly higher, Wednesday, supported by some overnight export sales of wheat and beans and corrections after Tuesday's sharp declines. Wheat mixed. Corn steady to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 8 cents lower. Soybeans 1 to 3 cents higher.  
Export wheat purchase by Egypt overnight offered some strength to bids. Additional support stemmed from declining crop conditions for hard red winter and soft red winter wheat crops due to hot temperatures and recent heavy rains. Many areas show disease development in crops receiving too much rain. Light profit taking on the Board was noted today in wheat pits.  
Corn and soybean bids were slightly higher following sharp declines Tuesday. Some export business has been reported for soybeans and talks of possible corn sales, underpinned bids. Wet weather forecast for the central U.S. and good crop condition, limited gains for both commodities.
