ST. BARNABAS DAY

↑t. Barnabas Day, on June 11, was traditionally the time for the start of haying. The most favorable time to cut hay, according to moonlore, is right after the full Moon, on June 16 this year. St. Barnabas Day was

also when the churches were decorated with box, woodruff, lavender, and roses This patron saint (along with St Francis of Assisi) was commonly invoked as a peacemaker or against hailstorms, as was his near calendar neighbor, St John the Baptist (June 24). St Barnabas was a companion of St Paul and is often depicted with him. Bearded and middleaged, St. Barnabas generally carries an olive branch or a book in his portraits.

On St. Barnabas, put the scythe to the grass.

CHOCOLATE BANANA PUDDING

- 1 cup chocolate chips, melted 2 ripe bananas
- 1 cup plain or vanilla yogurt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon orange juice pinch of salt
- 4 to 6 fresh berries, for garnish

elt chocolate over a double boiler (or in a microwave oven). Meanwhile, place bananas, in chunks, and yogurt into a blender, and pulse to just mix Add remaining ingredients and blend briefly

When chocolate is melted. add to the banana mixture and blend to just mix. (It's okay if the chocolate is still quite hot.) Pour pudding into individual serving dishes, cover tightly with plastic wrap, and

chill for at least 2 hours. Serve with fresh bernes on top.
