

## Twenty-Four High School Seniors Receive Agricultural Scholarships

NEWARK, Del. — Twenty-four high school seniors have received highly competitive scholarships from the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources at the University of Delaware (UD).

The Agriculture and Natural Resources Scholarship Awards — made possible through an endowment funded by the state of Delaware, agribusinesses, alumni, and individual donors to the university — are given on a competitive basis to incoming first-year students.

To qualify, applicants must be accepted by UD to major in agriculture and natural resources, have demonstrated academic achievement and service, and successfully complete faculty interviews. Scholarships are renewable for up to three additional years.

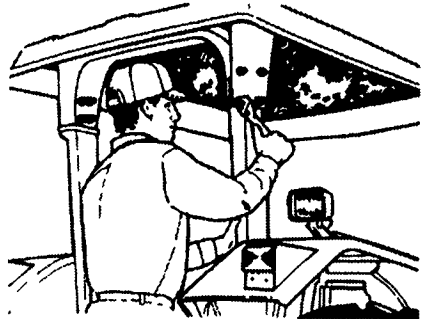
