Heavy rain showers moved across the Midwest overnight and relieved more drought fears. Light export sales of wheat and corn were reported, limiting losses. Soybean bids were higher, despite the beneficial rainfall overnight. Wheat 2 to 4 cents lower. Corn 2 to 5 cents lower. Sorghum 8 cents lower. Soybeans steady to 5 cents higher.

Wheat bids were narrowly mixed, Wednesday, with light profit taking noted. Export sales of wheat to South Korea were light. Pressure also stemmed from lower corn trade and good spring wheat crop condition. Texas reported light test weights in hard red winter

Corn bids fell moderately lower after overnight rains soaked some of the drier areas of the Corn Belt. Light export demand from Taiwan also weighed on bids.

Soybeans finished slightly higher after trading lower most of the day.

Wet weather conditions in Midwest areas added pressure. The rains were beneficial to new crop soybeans and the Board dropped twelve cents. Elevators continue to have rather substantial minus basis on new crop beans and bids by country elevators is moving down into the lower 4.00 level. Farmers are running another check on LDPs.






