The market tone was mostly steady to barely steady. Demand was generally light to moderate, and was best where scattered feature activity was a factor.

Supplies were at least adequate to available, instances ample on the smaller sizes. Breaking stock offerings were generally adequate, and demand for additional product was mostly light to no better than moderate.

Light type fowl were fully adequate for normal schedules.

 Wheat prices higher for the 4th consecutive day going right into full harvest season. Other commodities lower today  
 Wheat steady to 2 cents higher except Portland down 3 cents. Corn steady to 2 cents lower. Sorghum 1 to 2 cents lower.

Soybeans 4 to 8 cents lower. Rain delayed wheat harvest. Early cuttings, yields and test weights were not quite up to expectations. Winter wheat is matured up into the Southern edge of the cornbelts but fields are soggy. Also fairly good Export announcements for wheat this week. More rains forecast for the weekend. The moisture is beneficial for corn, soybeans and milo and prices turned back lower. No export announcements this week for corn or soybeans.
