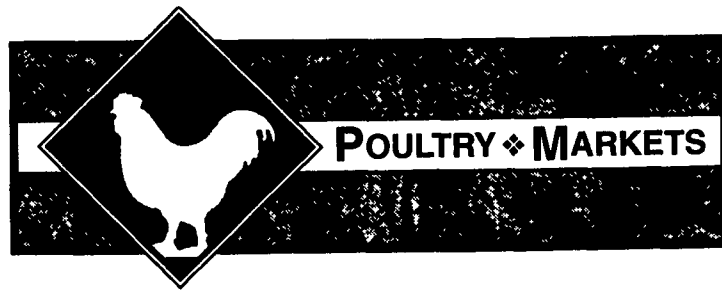

IN BOSTON, PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS LOWER ON EXTRA LARGE AND MEDIUM AND UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT LOWER ON LARGE. IN NEW ENGLAND, PRICES WERE 3 CENTS LOWER ON EXTRA LARGE THROUGH SMALL AND UNCHANGED FOR JUMBOS. THE MARKET TONE WAS WEAK. DEMAND WAS LIGHT TO MOSTLY FAIR AND SOMEWHAT BETTER WHERE FEATURES WERE IN PROGRESS. SUPPLIES WERE FULLY ADEQUATE TO AT TIMES AMPLE ON ALL SIZES. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIED FROM REGULAR SOURCES WERE IN CLOSE BALANCE FOR THE LIGHT DEMAND. LIGHT TYPE FOWL WERE FULLY ADEQUATE FOR SLAUGHTER NEEDS.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS, JUNE 23, 2000. FEDERAL-STATE

Prices were irregular but usually in a range of unchanged to slightly higher. However, trade sentiment was generally mixed on whole product, fully steady to firm on yolks, and barely steady on whites when compared to last week. Supplies were irregular, and mostly adequate for immediate trade needs. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 17, 2000 were 3 % less than last week, and 6 % less than a year ago.
