DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET. FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained generally slow in developing and behind projections for the upcoming holiday. Seller offerings varied by size and volume, but in total were fully adequate to ample for immediate needs. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 65 cents. Trade sentiment was no better than steady. Boneless skinless breasts were well balanced, instances short. Tenders were tight. Other cuts were generally noted as at least adequate.

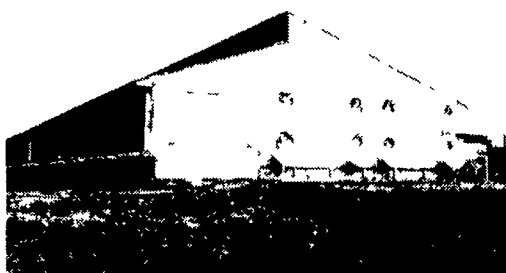

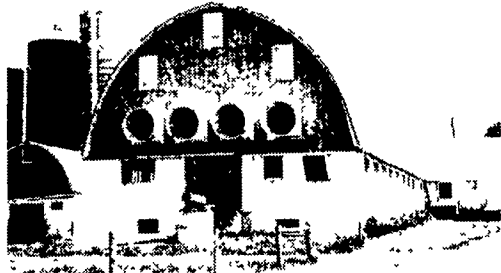

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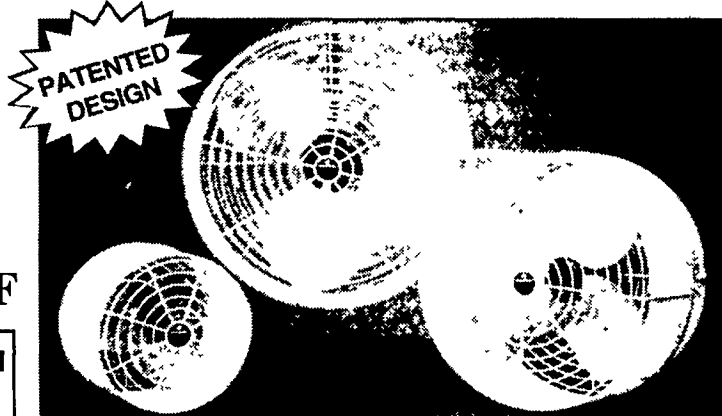
