

Juniors Parade Champions At 2000 Atlantic National Regional Preview Show

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. — Young Angus enthusiasts gathered for the 2000 Atlantic National Junior Angus Regional Preview Show, May 26-27 in Timonium, Md.

Brad McCurry, Sedgwick, Kan., evaluated the 62 bred-and-owned females, 122 owned females, 17 bred-and-owned bulls, 48 registered steers and nine cow-calf pairs before selecting his champions.

L V A Saugahatchee Sonic 901 led the bred-and-owned bull competition. Kimberly Long, Airville, Pa., owns the February 1999 son of Leachman Saugahatchee 3000C.

Jamie Hower, Bethlehem, Pa., showed the reserve grand champion bull. Just Enuff Rebar Justin is an April 1999 son of Sedgwicks Rebar.

In the bred-and-owned female show, Sunset Valley Phyllis 928 claimed grand champion honors for Morgan Woodward, Gallipolis, Ohio. The March 1999 daughter of Champion Hill B52 Traveler first won spring heifer calf champion.

Judson Dalton, Altavista, Va., captured the reserve grand champion bred-and-owned female award with Daltons and Jones Belle Unique. The April 1999 daughter of Sitz Traveler 043 earlier won reserve spring heifer calf champion.

Champion Hill Lady 1530 strolled to victory, winning grand champion owned female for Megan Weisel, Louisville, Ohio. The March 1999 daughter of Leachman Saugahatchee 3000C first won late spring heifer calf champion.

Jeff Covell, Frederick, Md., led Champion Hill Georgina 1138 to the reserve grand champion owned female title. She's a

March 1998 daughter of R R Scotchcap 9440, and first topped the junior division.

Daltons Rita BELLE188 of S&C won the grand champion cow-calf pair title for Judson Dalton, Altavista, Va. The April 1998 daughter of Rito 9FB3 of 5H11 Fullback has a February 2000 heifer calf at side. The calf is sired by Sitz Traveler 043.

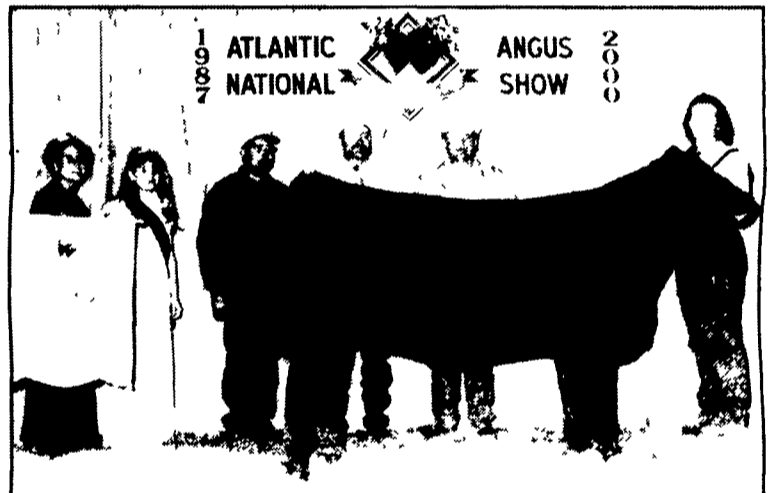
