Daily National Grain Market Summary

Grain and soybean bids higher today after personnel returned from the holiday and made some adjustments after such severe price declines were enforced last Friday and Monday. Wheat 1 to 2 cents higher, except Minneapolis 4 cents lower. Corn 2 to 4 cents higher. Sorghum 2 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 5 cents higher.

Grains inspected for export for week ended 6/29/00: Wheat totaled 19.5 million bushels, up 1.6 million bushels; corn 30.4, up 1.3; sorghum 1.2, down .5; and soybeans 14.1, up 5.8 compared to a week ago. Year to date: Wheat totaled 80.9, down 13.9; corn 1573.5, down 23.6; sorghum 179.4, up 35.5; soybeans 879.5, up 138.3. Crop marketing years begin June 1 for wheat; September 1 for corn sorghum and soybeans.
