Its high time for the people in Washington to wake up and recognize the importance of our producers receiving a fair price.


The producers will not receive a fair price as long as our bureaucrats continue to take us down the path of free trade instead of fair trade.


Its time producers receive a price based on production cost at the farm instead of what a manipulated market will yield.
