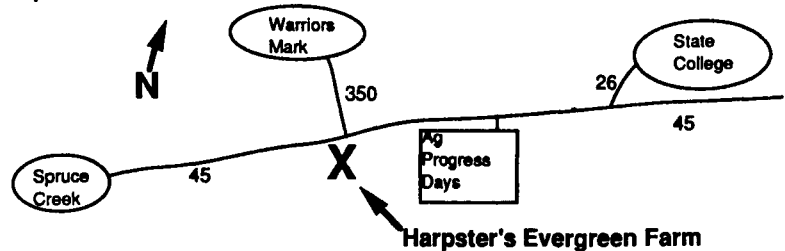


THE ANNUAL PFGC PICNIC and 40th Anniversary Celebration August 16, 2000

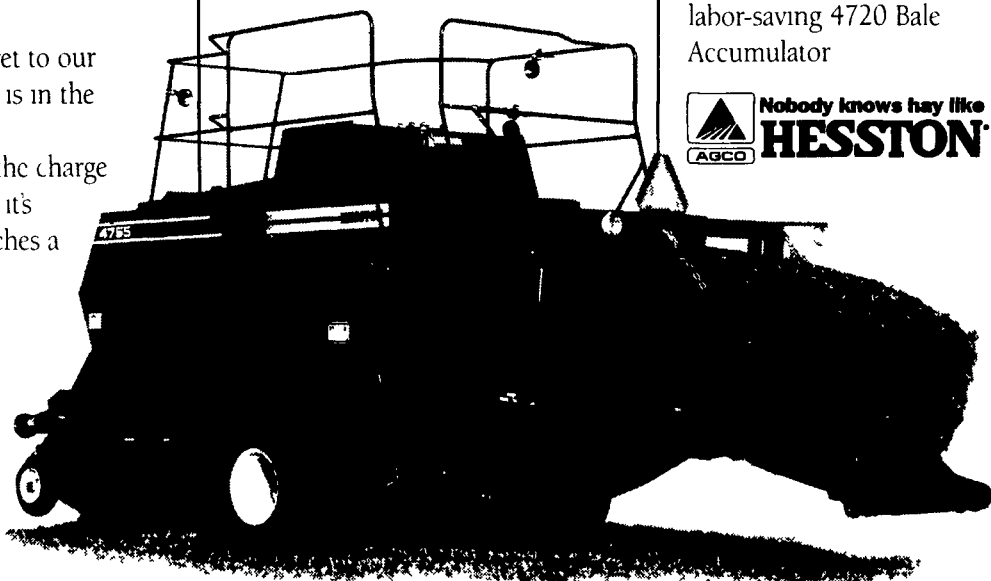

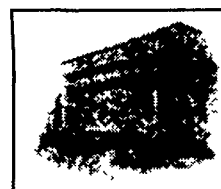
