Veal Farm Visited One of the tour stops included Jeff and Kathy Rohrer's new veal calf production facility.

Jeff had been a relief milker for dairy farmers and wanted to have his own farming enterprise. In March of 1998 the first calves were placed in the new 220-foot by 65-foot barn with capacity to house 400 head in four divisions. Each division is filled at different times to extend the opportunities to purchase and market the calves in various times of the year.

Feed is mixed in 2,200-pound capacity tanks and fed according to the nutritional needs of each calf. Jeff is certified under the veal quality assurance program and therefore is qualified to administer medication and maintain production practices that insure the best possible handling of the calves and production of veal.

Calves are taken in at 80 to 100 pounds and raised to 275 to

280 pounds. About 1,000 calves are finished each year for Marcho Farms Select Veal in Harleysville.


