Grain and soybean bids were mostly lower for the day with some strength showing up. Continued good crop condition and slow export sales offered weakness to bids. Wheat mixed, 1 cent higher to 1 cent lower. Corn 2 to 3 cents lower. Sorghum 4 cents lower. Soybeans mostly 1 to 6 cents lower.

Beneficial rains continue to fall in the Midwest and Corn Belt areas. A potential record corn crop is expected. Wheat bids received light support due to ideas the market has been oversold.
