ImAGination Station

Farm Animal Learning Center

animal production. More than 50 handouts, mostly for grades 3-8, cover almost every aspect of animal agriculture.

Shaver's Creek Environmental Center

Near the Equine Tent, above West 12th St. The "animal greenhouse" features the latest in animal science technologies. Dairy exhibits range from maximizing reproductive efficiency to the milk market. Veterinary science exhibits range from the latest in treatment and prevention of bovine mastitis to the impact of E. coli in food safety to animal and human health. See new technology that lowers odor emissions in swine and other agricultural facilities. Two live heifers are on display
