Stuart Patton received his bachelor's degree in dairy husbandry from Penn State in 1943 and went on to earn his master's and doctorate from Ohio State

University. He joined Penn State's dairy science faculty in 1949 and became the College of Agricultural Sciences' first Evan Pugh Professor in 1966.

He is known internationally for his research and teaching on milk chemistry and the biological processes that regulate milk synthesis in the mammary gland. He was awarded the 1999 Outstanding Alumni award from Penn State's College of Agricultural Sciences. In recent years, Patton has been adjunct professor in both the department of neurosciences at the University of California-San Diego and in the foods and nutrition program at San Diego State University.
