LEESPORT (Berks Co.) — Penn State Cooperative Extension of Berks County and The Berks County Sewing Guild will co-sponsor two Shirley Adams Sewing Seminars on Tuesday, September 12, at 1 p.m.-4 p.m. and 6 p.m.-9 p.m. located at the Berks County Agricultural Center.

The cost for one session is \$25 or for both sessions \$45. Registration must be received before August 31. Registration fees increase after that date.

Shirley Adams, inspirational host of the television sewing show called, The Sewing Con-

nection, comes from an educational background so teaching is her primary concern. With three degrees in clothing and textiles, she taught these subjects at the university level for many years. Now her "classroom" has expanded to include television stations all over the country, Canada and even Australia. She not only provides the quality information to perform such operations as setting-in sleeves and satisfying fitting problems, but she inspires her students to mix and match colors and materials — even create their own fabrics.

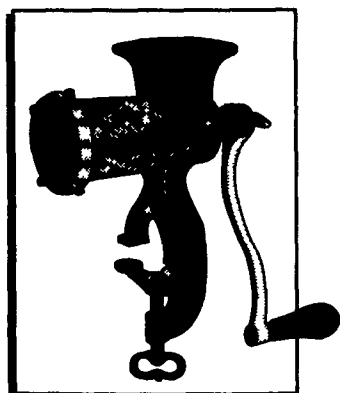
The two seminars will focus on different topics and a huge

collection of 150 garments will be displayed each time for everyone to see. Various fabric embellishments will also be highlighted. The daytime session (1-4 p.m.) will feature quick alterations, ways to easily solve pattern problems, ways to change the location of darts, changing styling but using the same pattern. The evening session (6-9 p.m.) will feature quick wardrobe additions and add-ons for suits and other garments that are suitable for business, church and many other occasions.

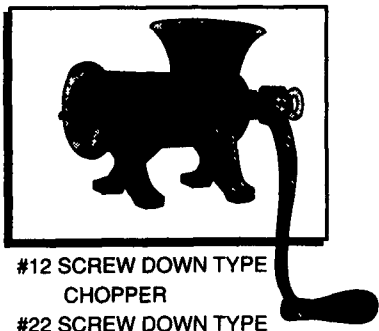

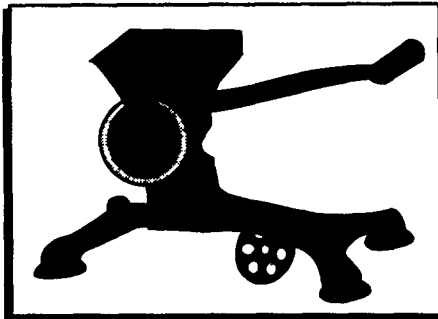

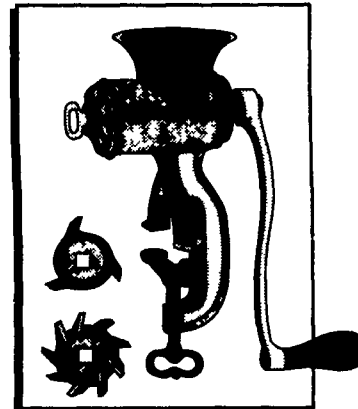
#5 CLAMP TYPE CHOPPER

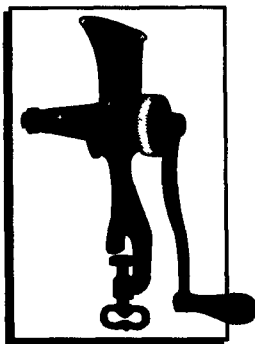
#1 CLAMPLESS TYPE CHOPPER



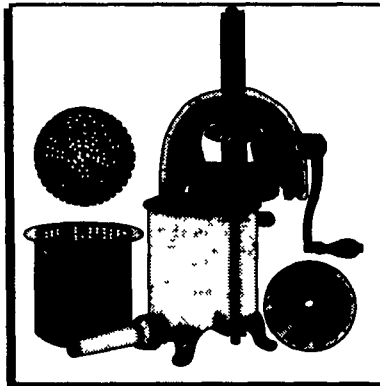

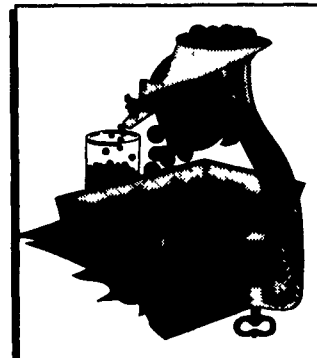
