

Daily National Grain Market **Summary**

St. Joseph, MO Aug. 9, 2000

Report Supplied By USDA

Light overnight export demand offered some strength to wheat bids.

However, most grain and soybean bids finished lower for the day due to good crop condition, scattered rainfall across the central Midwest, and a record corn crop expected. Wheat steady to 2 cents lower except Kansas City 6 cents higher. Corn steady to 2 cents lower. Sorghum 2 cents lower. Soybeans 1 to 4 cents lower.

Some weakness in soybean bids stemmed from reports of scattered showers in Cinese bean production areas and a cooler weather forecast for next week.


