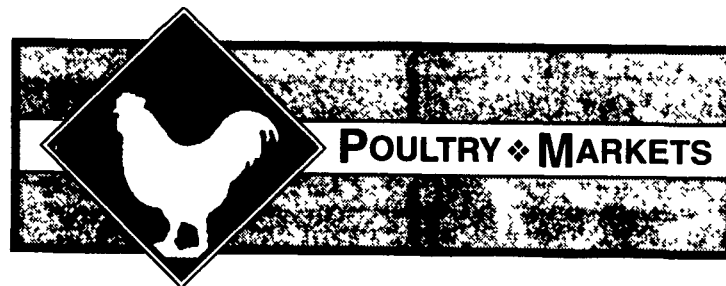

Demand ranged light to good usually slow on whites but still best for yolk products. Supplies were generally adequate. The market tone was steady to fully steady on whole, fully steady to firm on yolks and was about steady on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 05. 2000 were 10% less than last week and 13% less than the same week last year.
