Daily National Grain Market Summary
Weather and exports made for improved grain and soybean bids at midweek.
Wheat steady to 7 cents higher. Corn 3 to 4 cents higher. Sorghum 6 cents higher. Soybeans 5 to 9 cents higher.
Overnight wheat sales to Brazil helped

support bids, today. Indications that Egypt also bought winter wheat added to recent purchases by Brazil and Morocco. Spring wheat harvest is making good progress and tempered upturns.

Weather has become the major strengthening factor for corn and soybeans Bids lately, especially soybeans. Hot temperatures continue to beat down on already dry fields and crop stress is showing in many places. The most damage is being done in the western Corn Belt, Delta, and Southeast.

Soybean plants are podding at this time on numerous acres. In many areas, beans at the bottom of the plants are pretty well filled out. However, many places need more moisture and a little relief from the extreme heat for pods on the upper portion of the plants to reach maximum production. Rains are in and out of the Midwest forecasts daily and some areas have received enough to preserve yields. Eastern Corn Belt is getting a much larger percentage of coverage while the western Corn Belt and Southeast are receiving widely scattered showers. Corn is pretty much matured but another rain and cooler temperatures may help the ears develop fully.
