



late in the week. The market seems to have good stability at the current level with supply and demand being well matched, both locally and in the major feedlot areas. The current hurdle is the high cost of replacement feeders to eat this year's abundant crop. The price of fat cattle is almost exactly the same as last year at this time, yet feeder steers are selling at least 10.00 cwt higher. Western fat cattle sold steady to 1.00 higher this past week at mostly 66.00 live and 105.00 dressed. Local Holstein steers traded fully steady with much more competition than last week. Slaughter cows closed 1.00-1.50 higher on midweek gains, while slaughter bulls remained active and finished steady. Supply included 40 percent slaughter steers, 6 percent slaughter heifers, 39 percent slaughter cows, 4 percent slaughter bulls, with the balance feeders.
