clone of Lauduc Broker Mandy, owned by Carousel Farms, Orangeville, IL, will be offered at the World Classic 2000 sale during the Expo, for delivery in December 2001. Mandy, EX-95 2E, one of the most admired cows in the Holstein breed and a veteran of the World Dairy Expo showing, is the founder animal for the clone. She is a two time All-American and three time All-Canadian winner, with several impressive, high-component records and an outstanding pedigree behind her. She currently has a daughter that was named All-Canadian and both have sons active in A.I. line-ups. Recently named grand champion at the Illinois championship show, Mandy will be back again in the showing at Madison.

With the 1997 birth of Gene, the world's first cloned bovine from a non-embryo-delivered cell, nuclear transfer cloning technology moved closer to becoming a viable means of genetically tailoring herds of livestock, particularly dairy cattle. Not only can these animals be more efficient milk and meat producers, they are considered to be excellent candidates as "walking pharmaceutical factories," whose milk can be utilized for the production of difficult-to-produce pharmaceutical compounds.

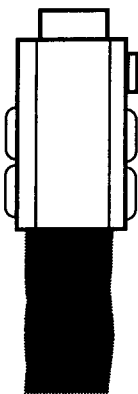



