

Crossbreds Dominate York 4-H Market Hog Show

BAIR (York Co.) — Lane Innerst's 4-H project account got a \$750 income boost at the annual market swine roundup and sale, Aug. 14 at the 4-H center's livestock exhibit facility.

The 15-year-old Red Lion hog exhibitor snagged champion market swine honors with a lean, stretchy 261-pound crossbred gilt boasting hams suggestive of a bodybuilder's biceps. Innerst's homebred winner was a triple-breed cross, incorporating bloodlines of a Hampshire boar and a Yorkshire Poland China Crossbred sow.

Buyer of the young hog breeder's first roundup champion was Joe Semeister, Windsong Farm Kennels, Red Lion, with an ante of \$2.87 per pound for the sale opener.

Second through the sale arena was Heather Miller of Glen Rock, nudging reserve champion "Clancy" to show off her winning qualities to the bleachers packed with buyers and guests on hand to bid and cheer. Longtime youth project supporter Hatfield Quality Meats, represented by buyer Kurt Good, held out for the winning bid of \$1.85 per pound for the 241-pound crossbred gilt.

Pairs champion honors went to the well-matched set raised by Cody Ault, whose 225- and 227-pound pigs brought a \$2-pound bid from Larry Becker of Stoney Point Construction Company, McSherrystown.

Runner-up pairs honor was

won by the 231-pound-each entries of Jessicya Robinson, Delta. Buyer of the pair, at \$1 per pound, was Marlyn Flaharty, Service Feed and Supply, Cardiff, Md.

Champion lightweight hog, weighing in at 226 pounds, was exhibited by Jared Miller and sold for \$1 per pound to Lee Godfrey for Godfrey Brothers Meats, York.

Randy Wilson took heavy-weight class division reserve honors, with his 270-entry bringing a 95-cent bid from Daniel Laughman, York.

Blaine Rentzel, in the first of numerous additions to bids, added a nickel to the price of Wilson's reserve weight class titlist. Rentzel, on behalf of his Rentzel's Auctioneering Service, then boosted every bid to a minimum \$1 per pound for all market swine exhibitor/sellers.

Jessica Innerst claimed the reserve mediumweight champion spot with her 246-pound hog, which sold for \$1.95 per pound Windsong Farm Kennels.

Strine Heating and Cooling, York, was the successful bidder for the 228-pound reserve champion lightweight, exhibited by Jason Seitz.

A total of 75 pigs were exhibited and sold at the annual event, averaging a price, with champions, of \$1.19 per pound and \$1.15 per pound without the champions.

Rick Jones, East Berlin, was named champion fitter and snagged reserve champion showman honors. Lane Innerst added a champion showmanship ribbon to her day's collec-

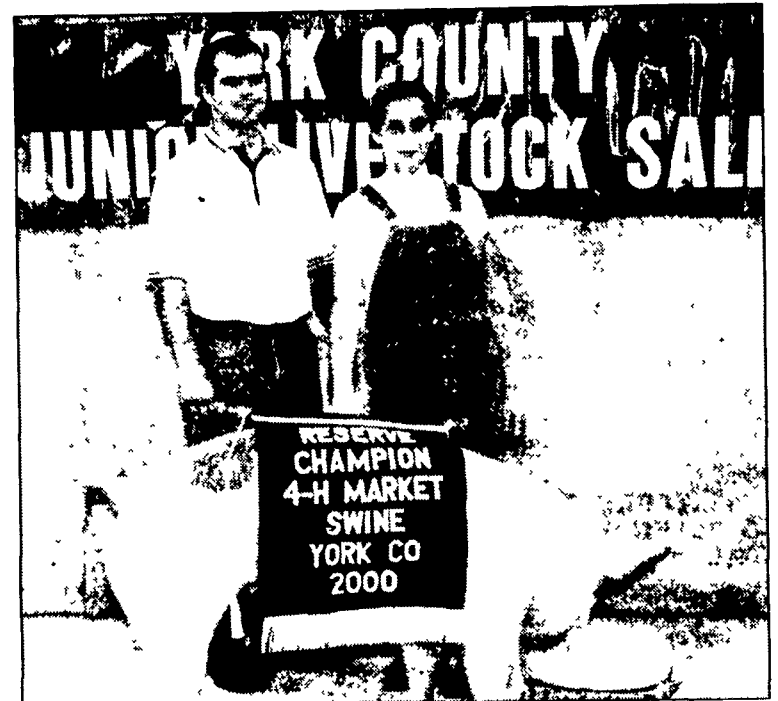
tion of trophies. Russ Lawrence was named reserve champion fitter.
