

## Record Year **For Crops?**

COLUMBUS, Ohio - According to a recent report out of Ohio University, this could be a record crop production year.

The USDA forecasts this fall's U.S. corn production at 10.4 billion bushels, up 10 percent from last year and up 6 percent from 1998. Based on conditions as of Aug. 1, yields are expected to average 141.9 bushels per acre, up 8.1 bushels from last year. If realized, this would be the largest production and highest yield on record since 1866, when corn estimates began.

Soybean production is forecast at a record



high 2.99 billion bushels, up 13 percent from 1999 and 9 percent above the previous record of 2.74 billion bushels set in 1998. Yields are expected to average 40.7 bushels per acre, up 4.2 bushels from 1999.

All this while current prices for corn are about \$1.50 per bushel, the lowest since 1987. Soybean prices are near \$4.65 per bushel — better than last year, but still the second lowest since 1972.
