Wheat bids were slightly lower on lack of fresh export interest and continued harvest pressure. Stronger corn and soybean bids were due to more hot temperatures moving across the Midwest and western Corn Belt areas over the next several days. Wheat steady to 1 cent lower. Corn mostly 4 to 5 cents higher. Sorghum steady. Soybeans 1 to 5 cents higher.

Export sales have slowed this week for all commodities and a report that Brazil will wash out one of its US wheat purchases, weighed on wheat bids.
