Type and showmanship judge, Patty McMurray who lives in Eighty-Four, Washington County, said that Roses Pepper Magic, a daughter out of HL Duncan Pepper and Roses Hermitage Missy, could handle the most competition of any cow there. "She is the most correct cow," McMurray said about Magic.

Wendy Rose is from Hol-Isopple and a member of Stitch-N-Squirt 4-H Club. Shallow Run Farm, New Florence, was the cow's breeder.

Holstein breed reserve champion was owned by Justine Stoltzus, Berlin. The spring yearling named Pennwood C Lee Vicky is out of Comestar Lee-ET and Pennwood Skybuck Haley. Breeder was Harvey Stoltzfus, Berlin.

Adam Coleman, Berlin, had the grand champion in the Brown Swiss with Colecream Sensation Bea, a fall yearling. Reserve champion was Four D Betts Brown Sugar, a junior 2-year-old owned by Derek Leister, Berlin.
