### Louisville Slugger Museum, Kentucky

From Babe Ruth to Sammy Sosa baseball players have used the Louisville Slugger. A visit to the museum includes a trip through the plant where bats are made, an underground locker room and a full size dugout. There's even a ball and glove carved from very old limestone.

### The Dinosaur Museum, Utah

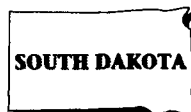
Check out the complete history of dinosaurs at this museum in Blanding. You can see dinosaur skeletons, eggs from around the world, footprints and fossilized skin.

### Mount Rushmore, South Dakota

See four American presidents—George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln—carved in the stone of the Black Hills. Their faces are 60 feet high and 500 feet off the ground. It took 14 years and \$1 million to carve the mountain.

### Whitefish Point Bird Observatory, Michigan

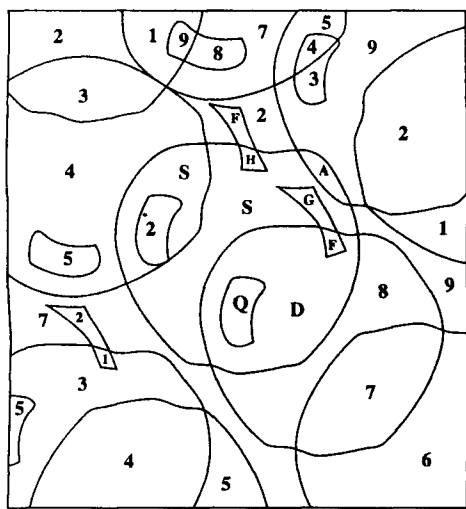

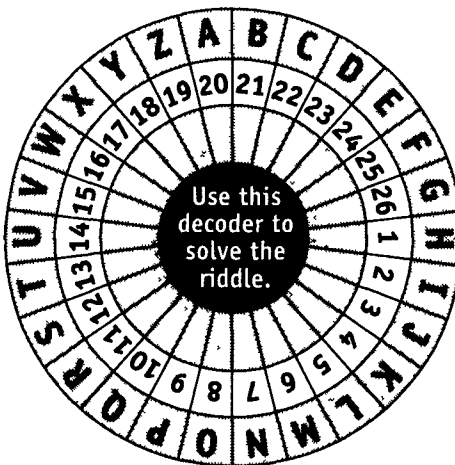

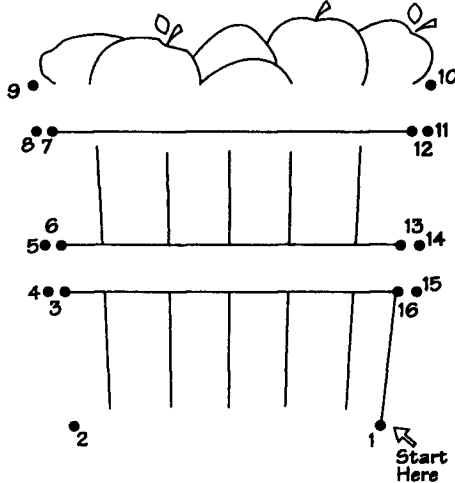
