Louisa, Va.; and Jane Saunders, Richmond, Va., own the February 1999 daughter of V D A R Lucys Boy. She was named junior champion female earlier that day.

T K Barbara 79 won reserve grand champion female. The January 1999 daughter of T K Krugerrand 397 exhibited by Joseph Epperly, Moneta, Va., was first named reserve junior champion female.

Whitestone Battalion L136

won grand champion bull. The January 1999 son of Whitestone Widespread MB is owned by Whitestone Farm, Battalion Associates, and Mark Duffell, all from Aldie, Va. He was first named junior yearling champion bull.
