

# Globe-Run Dominates At Huntingdon County Fair

**HUNTINGDON** (Huntingdon Co.) — The Huntingdon County Fair each year plays host to three dairy shows in one week — the 4-H and FFA show, held this year on Monday, August 14, the open Dairy Show held the following day, and the Holstein Association's Central Pennsylvania Championship Show held that Saturday evening.

Members of Globe-Run Farm, owned by the Foster family of Petersburg, won Holstein grand champion honors at all three shows. In Monday's youth show, Samantha Foster won Holstein grand champion and Brown Swiss junior champion while her sister, Charann Foster, won Holstein junior champion and Guernsey grand champion.

In the open Ayrshire show, Plum Bottom Farm, near Belleville won both junior and reserve junior champion honors while Alan Roger Brant showed the

grand champion animal and Carolyn Loucks won reserve grand champion.

The open Brown Swiss show saw Brandy Horning winning grand champion, Ian Michael Hayden winning reserve champion, Rebecca Mowrer winning junior champion, and Golden-Dream Holsteins winning reserve junior champion.

Snider Homestead Farm of New Enterprise dominated the Guernsey show by winning all four top honors.

Autumn-View Holsteins of Petersburg won junior Holstein champion honors. Golden-Dream Holsteins won reserve junior champion and reserve grand champion, and Globe-Run took grand champion honors.
