

In Philadelphia and Boston, prices were unchanged to 2 cents lower on the larger sizes and unchanged for mediums. Prices paid to producers in New England were 1 cent lower for extra large and large, unchanged on the balance of sizes. The market tone was barely steady to weak on the larger sizes and mostly steady for the lighter weight eggs. Demand into all outlets was light to fair, soemwhat better where scattered features were in progress. In the Philadelphia area, one dozen large eggs were free with an additional purchase. Supplies were adequate to available for current needs. Breaking stock offerings from regular sources were at least adequate and demand for additional product was light. Light type hens were generally adequate for slaughter needs.
