Other sizes were noted as irregularly available, but at least adequate. Live supplies were moderate, weights varied in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 51 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment was firm. 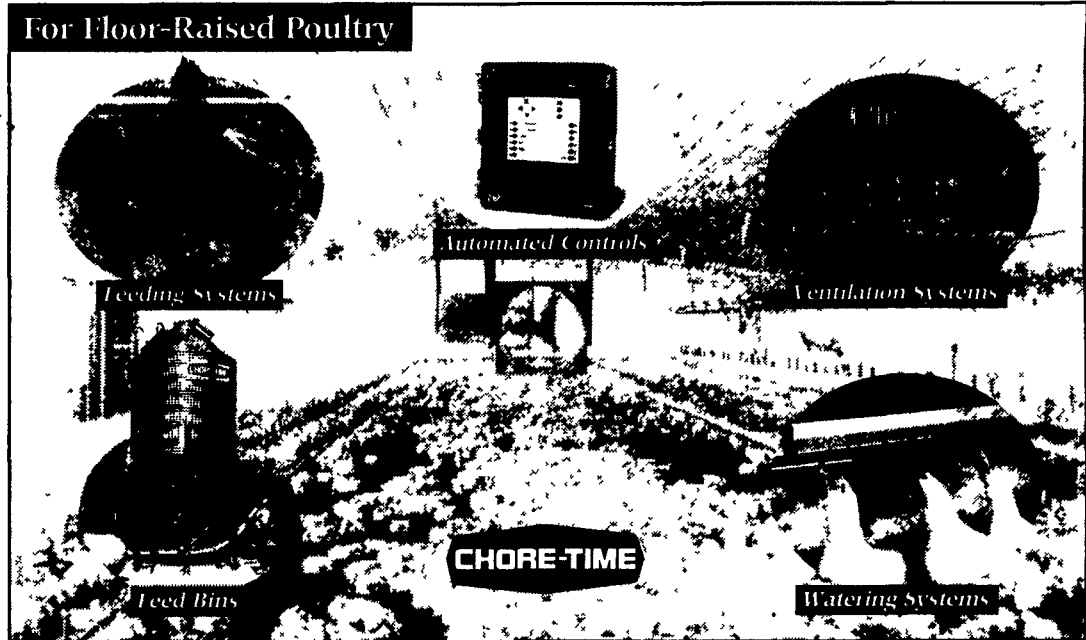
