Administration Offers Grants

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Agriculture Secretary Samuel E. Hayes Jr. recently announced that rural youth organizations may apply for direct grants and matching funds to support their educational projects and activities under the Agriculture Department's Agriculture and Rural Youth Organization Grant Program.

"Our youth are the future of agriculture, and we are pleased to offer these grants," Hayes said. "The grants will help these organizations expand activities that educate our youth in issues that affect their agricultural communities and rural Pennsylvania."

A total of \$25,000 is available for the grant program, which is funded by proceeds from a trust fund through the USDA.

Organizations may apply for

direct grants of up to \$2,500. Applications must be post-marked by Dec. 1 to be considered

Grants can be used by 4-H and FFA organizations and agricultural vocational-technical classes to fund educational projects, programs, seminars, or field trips to increase awareness of agricultural and rural issues.

Recipients will be selected by a 13-member Agriculture and Rural Youth Grant Board.


