Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds slowed on all sizes. Seller offerings were readily available, particularly on the heavier sizes. Live supplies were moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 54 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. In the parts complex, Wings continued to clear well. Gizzards and Livers were in tight supply. Other cuts, particularly bone-in and boneless skinless breasts had in-

creased in availability and were difficult to clear.

Rains halted combines many places but harvest off t a very early start and farmers not stressed out yet. Wheat 1 to 2 cents higher. Corn steady to 6 cents higher. Sorghum 1 cent higher. Soybeans 3 to 9 cents higher.
Producers and elevators needed a little break to service machinery and elevate transporting problems. Early yield reports varied considerably and for the most part, a little below expectations. Moisture contents of both beans and corn below discount levels and no premiums paid for lower measurements. Small export announcements today but most foreign and domestic buyers fell that prices will get even lower with full harvest pressure. Senate voted to permanently normalize trade with China, hoping to open it to American products

and improve export business with this country.

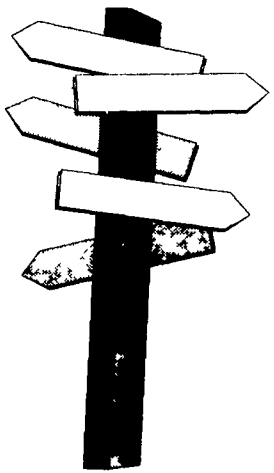

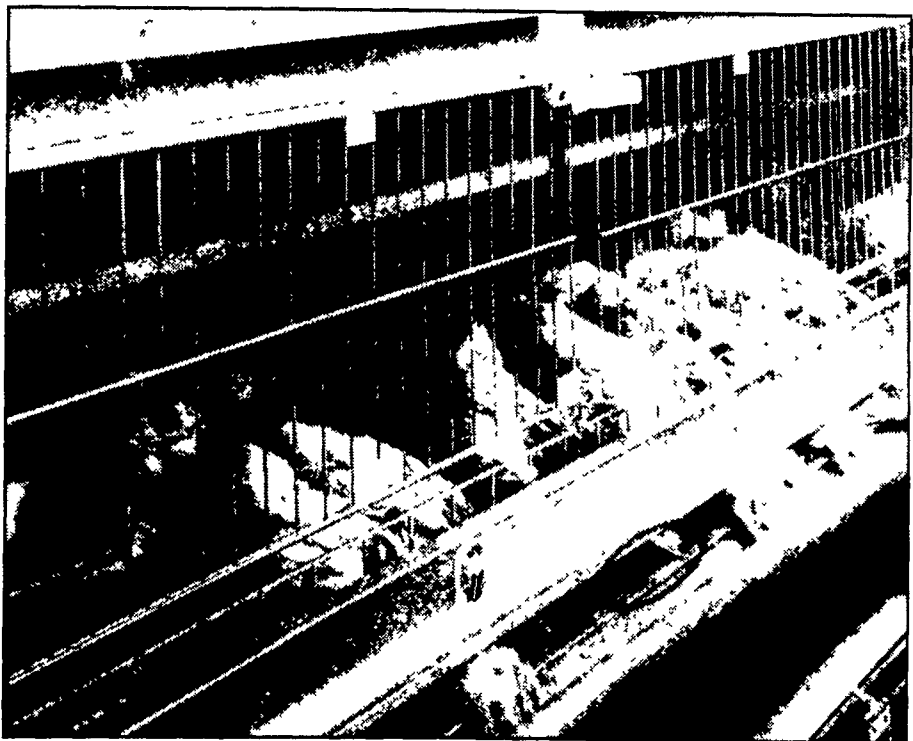

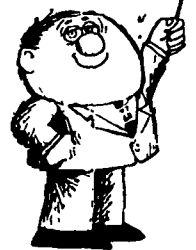
