 Daily National Grain Market Summary

Grain and soybean bids were slightly higher for the day. The major support factors were good export interest, a slight drop in crop condition ratings for corn and beans and slow winter wheat plantings. Wheat 1 to 2 cents higher. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum 2 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 3 cents higher.

Winter wheat seeding is reported to be 21 percent complete which is behind the average 30 percent for this date. Some fund buying on the Boards also boosted bids. Egypt purchased a substantial amount of winter wheat overnight.

South Korea bought corn overnight and USDA showed a drop in crop condition last night for corn and soybeans. Both commodities are showing rapid harvest progress, however, many areas report poor bean quality. Some elevators are turning them down or very severe price discounts.

Due to late summer drought, pods at

the top of the stalk did not completely fill out. They are only buckshot size, mixed colors, and cut green as they did not fully mature. This really hurt both quality and yield. Corn harvest is around 25 percent complete and beans 20 percent binned. Sunshine over the entire Corn and Bean Belts today after weekend rains and combines rolling full steam again.
