The show was at the Lebanon Area Fairgrounds.



### **Youth Event**


York County 4-H member Cory Stump received second place honors at the Pennsylvania State 4-H Achievement Days Horse Presentation Contest in August.



## Manage On-Lot Septic System

YORK (York Co.) - The York County Conservation District is sponsoring a workshop on "Managing Your On-Lot Septic System" for homeowners and municipal officials. Information on proper design, installation, and maintenance of residential sewage subsurface disposal systems and remedies for failing systems will be presented.

The Managing Your On-Lot Septic System will be held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 24 at the Warrington Township Municipal Building, located on State Route 177, approximately 1/8 mile east of Rossville.
