


Another major study has confirmed it. increased can see production with Cargill FullTime Forage. In a 1999 USDA study in Beltsville Maryland, cows whose diet included Cargill FullTime Forage (vs normal corn silage) consumed 11% more dry matter and increased milk production by 6.9 pounds per cow per day. This agrees with a Michigan State University study which demonstrated at 6% increase in dry matter intake, an increase of 7.2 more pounds of milk per cow per day.
