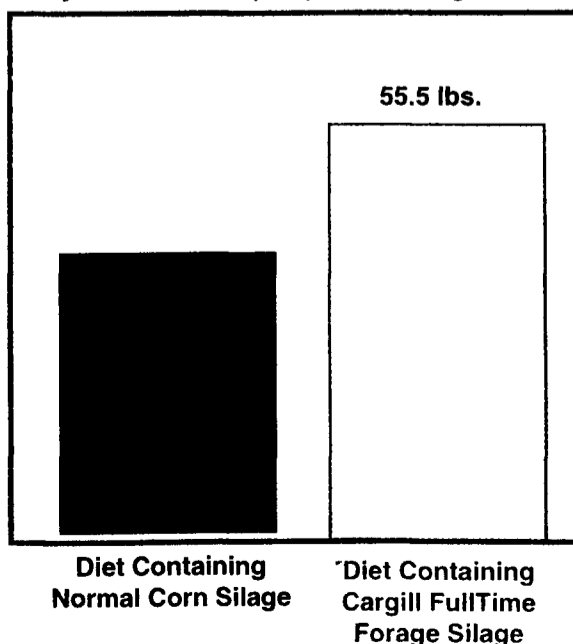
A range of studies has shown the dramatic increase in milk production with Cargill FullTime forage. With FullTime forage you get high fiber digestibility, low lignin, improved dry matter intake and better cow performance from a rumen-friendly diet.

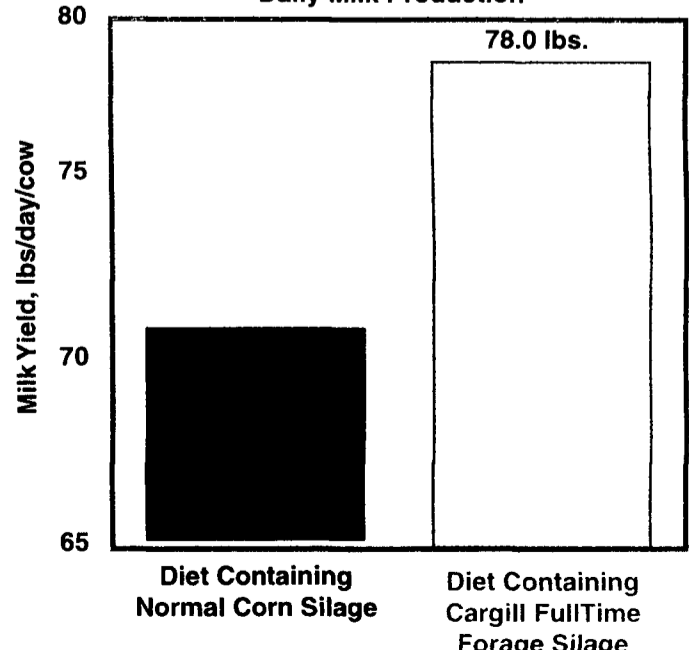

Another major study has confirmed it. You can see increased milk production with Cargill FullTime Forage. In a 1999 USDA study in Beltsville Maryland, cows whose diet included Cargill FullTime Forage (vs normal corn silage) consumed 11% more dry matter and increased milk production by 6.9 pounds per cow per day. This agrees with a Michigan State University study which demonstrated at 6% increase in dry matter intake, an increase of 7.2 more pounds of milk per cow per day.
