"I told him, if you could find lumber, you'd have a business," said Terry, who was in the lumber business for 20 years as part owner and operator of Meiser Lumber Company.

"I knew how difficult it was getting timber. I spent a lot of time and money finding timber when I was in the business, and that was years ago," he said.

"We spent three months putting together the business, the system, and how we were going to work it," said Nathan. "The first few months were spent figuring it out, deciding if it was something we wanted to do." The company, Timberleads, began by the beginning of March.

The Meiser family divides up the workload. Nathan takes care of the leads and contacts from the farmers, Terry handles the timber subscribers, and Terry's daughter Kathy oversees "everything else," said Terry, which includes administrative, bookLancaster Farming, Saturday, October 14, 2000-A37


work, scheduling, advertising and marketing responsibilities. Terry's wife, Jennie, is "our biggest cheerleader," said Nathan.
