

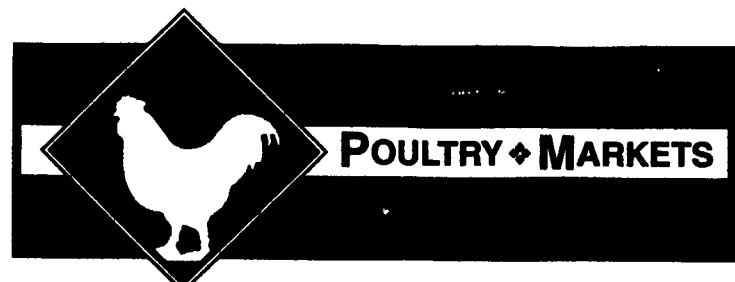

Live supplies were moderate; weights ranged light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were mostly moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 47 to 61 cents. Trade sentiment was generally steady. Bone-in breast were in close balance to tight and clearing well. Wings were in good demand and clearing satisfactorily. Boneless skinless breast were readily available.
