



Penn State Expands Trial Garden Sites Across Pa.

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — In the second year of an evaluation project called the Gardener Selects program, experts in Penn State's College of Agricultural Sciences will plant the seeds for thousands of flower and vegetable varieties in gardens at 38 sites across Pennsylvania, including 10 new sites.

"We're planting 20 to 30 of the best new cultivars from our Horticulture Trial Gardens in gardens at public parks or Penn State Cooperative Extension offices throughout Pennsylvania," said Robert Berghage, associate professor of horticulture.
