Colo., is donating a choice lot between two full sisters that will also sell in Denver. The heifers were born in February 2000 and are sired by Northern Improvement 4480 GF.

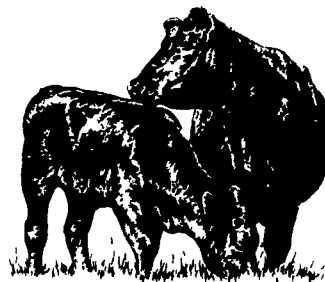

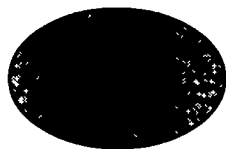

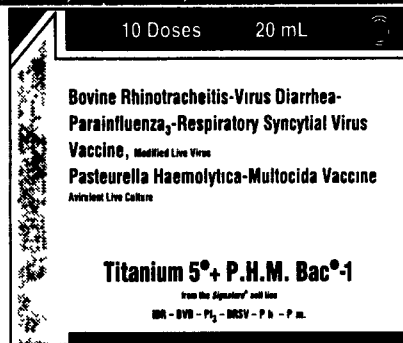
