Trucklot buying activity ranged light to no better than moderate today as dealers continued to assess market developments and maintain balanced floor stocks. Offerings of boneless-skinless breasts were fully adequate, and bone-in breasts had increased availability. Wings were at least adequate and dark meat items were usually available, however, drumsticks and thighs were no more than adequate and often moving well. Movement into retail and distributive channels was about fair to moderate at best. The market tone was fully steady on drumsticks and thighs, no better than steady on the balance.
