Pseudorabies is a viral disease in swine that affects the nervous and reproductive systems of swine. Pseudorabies has threatened the viability of the swine industry since the 1980s. The last pseudorabies-infected swine farm was released from quarantine in March 1999.

After one year without any new pseudorabies cases, Pennsylvania became eligible to apply for Level V "Pseudora-bies-Free Status" in the Na-
