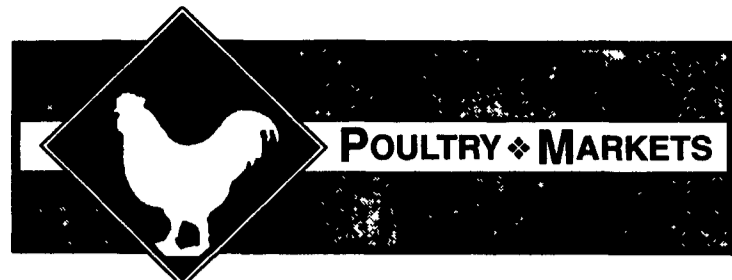

The market tone was steady to fully steady on yolks, fully steady on whole, and unsettled to about steady on whites. Trading was limited with demand light to moderate. Supplies were close balanced to adequate for current needs. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending October 28, 2000 were 6% less than last week, and 5% percent less than a year ago.

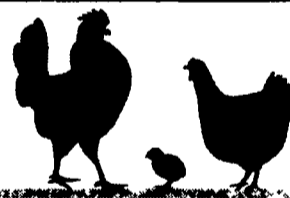
