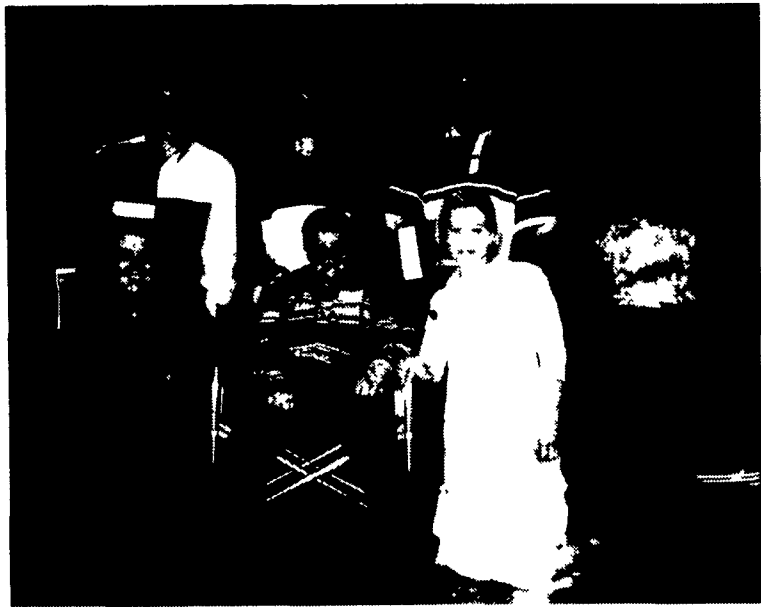


# Berks 4-H Conducts Banquet

Many 4-H'ers, family members, friends, and supporters enjoyed a meal of beef, sausage and lamb, along with all the trimmings.

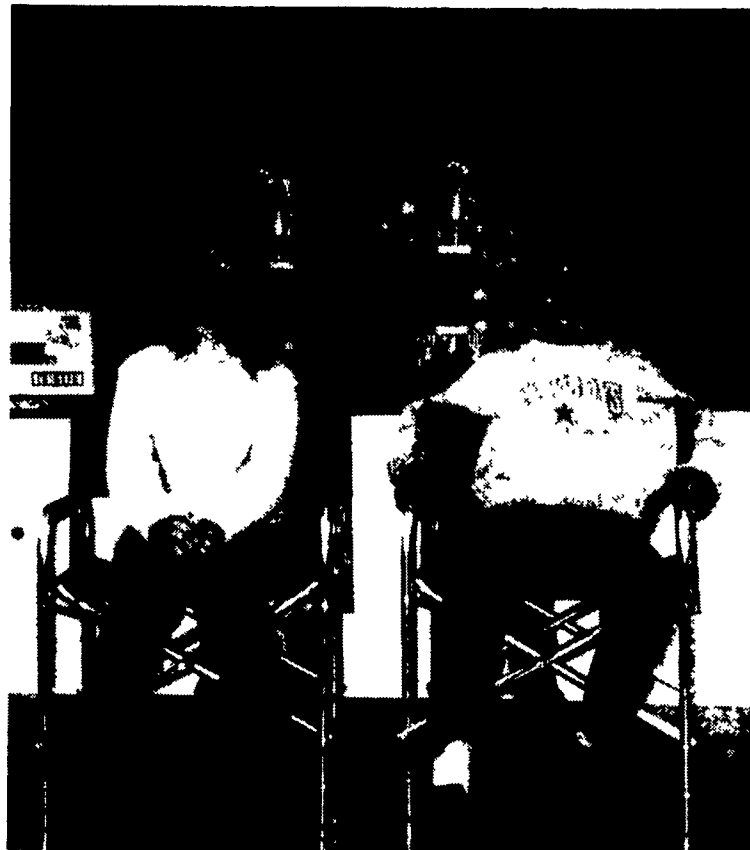
Immediately following the meal awards were presented to the 4-H'ers from the five livestock clubs.
