Grain and Soybeans bids were mostly lower due to slower export demand and some profit taking on the Board. Wheat were 1 to 5 cents lower. Corn mostly 2 to 5 lower except Kansas City 11 cents lower. Sorghum 5 cents lower. Soybeans 1 to 3 cents lower. Wheat bids were slightly lower as Soft Winter Wheat condition improves. Fair overnight export trade for wheat. Corn and Soybeans fell moderately lower also due to lack of fresh export news.
