Movement of ready-to cook whole birds was again noted as seasonally light to moderate. Seller offerings remained readily available and competitively priced. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate, instances moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 52 to 66 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly weak. In the parts complex, seller confidence was building where inquiry for bone-in breasts was increasing. Other items were at least adequate for the light to fair and mostly cautious buying interest.

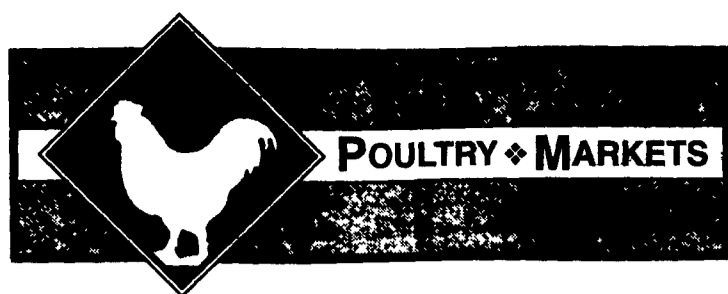
