Light type hens were sufficient for processing needs.

Wheat bids lost more ground due as beneficial snow cover continued to fall over winter wheat growing areas. Some export disappointments weighed on wheat bids as reports show Turkey and Pakistan sold some various classes of wheat to Afghanistan. Corn bids moved slightly higher on fund buying and carryover strength from yesterday's substantial export purchase. Not much change in soybean bids, today, soybean meal prices declined, favorable weather conditions are reported in South American bean areas, and export sales remain very slow this week. However, indications that China bought nearly 4 million bushels of US soybeans, limited losses.
Wheat steady to 3 cents lower. Corn 1 to 2 cents higher. Sorghum 3 cents higher. Soybeans unchanged.
