Majority prices were unchanged to slightly higher on sugar yolk, other majorities were unchanged when compared to a week earlier. Trading was limited with traders usually in a holiday mode. Supplies were adequate but usually not offered out at discounts. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending December 16, 2000 were 69% more than last week but 18% less than a year ago.

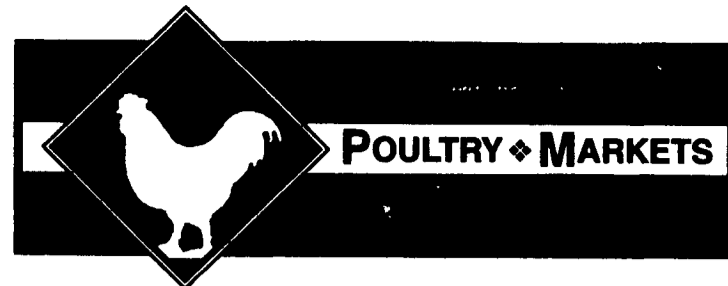

Movement into retail and distributive channels was limited. The market tone was weak on bone-in breasts, fully steady to firm on wings, about steady on the balance.
