

# Agriculture Department To Sponsor Website Agriculture Exhibit

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — On behalf of Gov. Tom Ridge, Agriculture Secretary Samuel Hayes announced that the Department of Agriculture's exhibit at the 85th Pennsylvania Farm Show features a Website agriculture display to showcase how the power of the Internet can help farmers compete in the new economy of the 21st century.

"To help move Pennsylvania agriculture into the 21st century, we need to use 21st century technology," Hayes said. "The Internet is a valuable tool — as

important as farm machinery and new production methods — that farmers can use to access information on a vast array of topics, ranging from animal and plant nutrition, farm finances, genetics, farm-management programs, commodity prices, and online purchases.

"We are bringing Website agriculture to our 2001 Farm Show exhibit."

Hayes said the display — at the Agriculture Department's exhibit in the Main Exhibit Hall — would enable farmers and Farm Show visitors to access

agriculture-related Websites and learn more about agricultural-related information on the Internet.

Future Farmers of America members from the Solanco, Manheim Central, Upper Dauphin Area, Cumberland, West Snyder, Dover Area, Newport, Greenwood, Middleburg, and McConnellsburg chapters will be on hand each day to help visitors access the agricultural Websites.

Hayes said the Agricultural Department exhibit will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day of the Farm Show.

The AICA is the official beef cattle registry of the Charolais breed, with more than 5,500 active adult and junior mem-

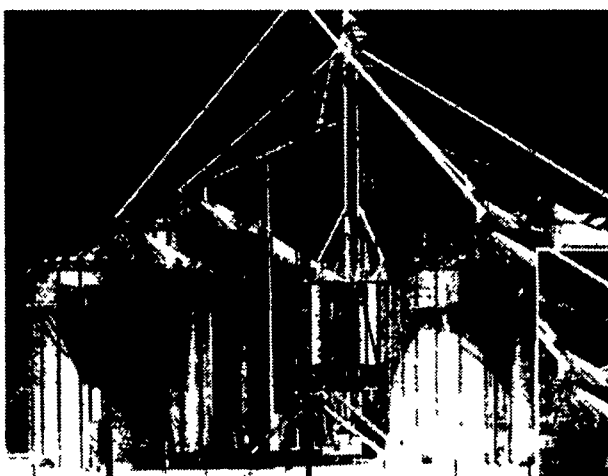
bers. The association maintains the pedigree, performance and carcass information on individual animals for its members.
