

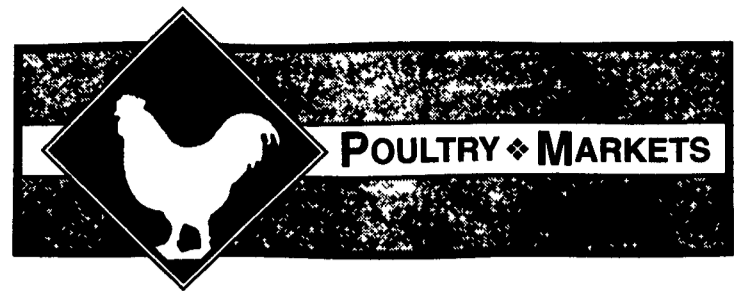

The market tone was mixed in a full range of steady to weak. Demand varied from area to area, but was mostly moderate to good overall. Supplies of all sizes were adequate to barely adequate. Breaking stock offerings were at least adequate to adequate and demand was light to moderate. Light type hens were sufficient for reduced slaughter requirements.

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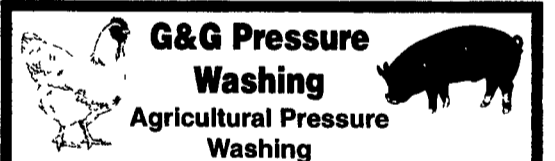
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
